

Announcement from Hin Son Provincial Police Station : Anti-Bribery Policy Fiscal year 2024

According to the Organic Act on Prevention and Suppression of Corruption, B.E. 2018, Section 128, paragraph one, prohibits any government official from receiving property or any other benefit that may be calculated as income from anyone. In addition to assets or benefits that are appropriate according to laws, rules or regulations. issued by virtue of the provisions of the law Except for receiving property or any other benefits. By ethics according to the criteria and numbers set by the NACC and the Code of Ethics for Police Officers 2021. 2(2) Honest Performing duties according to law Regulations of the Royal Thai Police with transparency Do not display behavior that is suggestive of exploitation. Illegally responsible for human rights duties Be ready to receive audits and accept responsibility. have a good conscience Consider society and item 2 (4) Think of the common good more than personal gain, have public spirit, cooperate and join together. and sacrifice in doing benefits for the public and creating benefits and happiness for society, together with a plan to reform the country in terms of preventing and suppressing corruption and misconduct (Revised Edition) Set out important reform activities. Activity 4 : Develop the Thai bureaucratic system. Be transparent No benefits. Goal 1, Section 1.1, have all government agencies announce that all government officials will not accept gifts and presents of any kind in the performance of their duties (No Gift Policy).

Therefore, in order to prevent conflicts between personal interests and public interests (Conflict of Interest), accepting bribes, gifts, gifts, or any other benefits that affect the performance of duties. Therefore, guidelines for anti-bribery (Anti-Bribery Policy) and not accepting gifts and gifts have been established. or any other benefits (No Gift Policy) from performing duties The details are as follows:

Article 1. This announcement

" Commander " means a person who has the authority to order, supervise, and follow up. and inspect the police officers under its jurisdiction

"Bribe" means property or any other benefit given to a person to induce that person to act or not act in a position. Whether it is right or wrong according to duty

"Performing duties" means the actions or performance of duties of government officials. in the appointed position or has been assigned to perform any duties or to act instead In any duty, both general and specific, as a police officer, as determined by law. Powers and duties or acts in accordance with the powers and duties specified by law to be the powers and duties of the police.

"Gifts, presents, or any other benefits that affect the performance of duties" means money, property, services, or any other benefits that have value and include tips. Government officials receive in addition to salary, income, and government benefits in normal cases and affect decisions, approvals, permissions, or anything else in the performance of their duties in a manner that benefits the provider in a dishonest way. Gifts either in the past or at the time of receipt or in the future.

Article 2 . Police officers at all levels shall conduct themselves as follows:

1. Do not ask for advice, do not give or accept bribes, gifts, gifts or any other benefits from Perform duties

2. Do not consent or connive with family members giving or receiving bribes, gifts, gifts. or any other benefits to those involved in performing duties

3. Performing duties must adhere to Enforce the law with fairness, based on benefits. and the image of the police is important Must not do anything that is a conflict between personal interests. and public benefits such as receiving gifts or any other benefits that affect the performance of duties , the use of government resources for personal gain , the disclosure of inside information , the use of official time to do extra work, etc.

4. Reduce the giving or receiving of property or any other benefits in accordance with the principles of ethics. and the amount specified by the NACC Office by using the method of expression by signing greeting cards, greeting books, and condolence cards. or using social media instead of giving things

5. Do not accept, do not tolerate, do not ignore the behavior of accepting bribes, gifts, gifts or any other benefits. from performing duties If any violations are found, the Superintendent / Station Head will be informed immediately.

Article 3 gives the commander the authority to supervise, monitor, and inspect police officers under his supervision. Behave according to this announcement. In the event that any action that violates this announcement is found, please report it to the Superintendent / Station Head immediately.

Article 4. Anyone found to have acted in violation of this announcement. You can make a complaint/report a clue. directly Through the station chief at Hin Son Police Station or via telephone number 081 7363545 which the information of the complainant/informer will be concealed and kept strictly secret.

Article 5. In the case of receiving a complaint/clues Personnel under the jurisdiction who commit such offenses will be investigated at the police station. And if an offense is found, the person who committed the crime will be punished. Strictly according to relevant laws, rules and regulations. and send matters according to the next command hierarchy

Measures to protect complainants/informers and confidentiality

1. Consideration of complaints Set the level of secrecy and protect those involved according to regulations. Concerning the maintenance of official secrets, B.E. 2001, and sending matters to be delayed for consideration. Information providers and complainants may suffer, for example, complaints against government officials are initially considered government secrets. Consider only the cases with specified evidence. The surrounding circumstances are clearly evident. as well as pointing out certain personal witnesses only Whistleblowing of influential persons must be anonymous and Petitioner's address If the complainant's name and address are not concealed Must notify relevant agencies and provide protection to the complainant. The commander shall use discretion and order as appropriate to protect the complainant, witnesses, and persons providing information in the investigation. Do not suffer harm or injustice that may result from complaints. Testifying or giving information In the case of specifying the name of the accuser, both the complaining party must be protected. and the respondent Because the matter has not yet gone through the fact-checking process. And it may be bullying and accusations that will cause suffering and damage. In the case where the complainant specifies in the request to conceal or do not wish to reveal the names of the complainants The agency must not disclose the names to the complainant agency because the complainant may suffer as a result of the complaint.

2. When making a complaint The complainant and witnesses will not be subject to any action. that affects work or livelihood. If any action is necessary Must receive consent from the petitioner and witnesses.

3. Complaints from victims, complainants, or witnesses, such as requests to move workplaces. Methods for prevention or solve problems Should be considered by responsible persons or agencies as appropriate.

4. Provide protection to the complainant from being bullied.
